Foreshore Access, More Community Green Space and Memorial in Store for Brunswick Heads

The Brunswick Heads community are invited to a sneak preview of some exciting concepts proposed for the three North Coast Holiday Parks (NCHP) in the area ahead of a formal public exhibition and feedback.

The proposed concepts take into account community and stakeholder feedback given in 2014 and at park walkthroughs conducted in November last year.

The session will be held at the Ocean Shores Country Club this Thursday, 9 March 2017 in consultation with Byron Shire Council and is an extra consultative step being taken by NSW Crown Holiday Parks Trust (NSWCHPT) before any formal processes to change the Plans of Management begin.

Registrations are filling fast with more than 100 people expected to attend the session. Those in attendance will have a chance to view concepts which address a number of features the Brunswick Heads community have been asking for.

Featured aspects of the amended concepts include:

- Integration of public space within the holiday parks
- Continued, unfettered access along the foreshore
- More green space within and surrounding the parks
- Sustainable urban designs
- Rationalisation of road networks
- Care and protection of the current Cypress Pine grove in Terrace Reserve
- Establishment of a community space connecting to the foreshore walkway which incorporates an interactive memorial area

NSWCHPT CEO Steve Edmonds said new concept plans presented at the Community Information Session addressed feedback given in an extended consultative process.

“Our revised concept plans feature more green space and signal a commitment to the simple relaxed pleasures that Brunswick Heads is known for,” Mr Edmonds said.

“Accommodation across the three parks will be highly affordable with on-site cabins and spaces dedicated to caravanning and camping which we expect to flourish under these new concepts.

“These plans grant the community and visitors to the Brunswick Heads area with continued, unfettered access to the foreshore and integrates public green space within our parks.

"We are also pleased to be looking at environmentally sustainable accommodation which will integrate well with the surrounding area to provide a natural flow. We look forward to continuing to work closely with the people of Brunswick Heads to improve the parks' public amenities and community value.

Following the session, amended concepts will be submitted to the NSW Minister for Lands and Forestry, Paul Toole, seeking approval to exhibit. Upon approval, the Plans of Management will go to public exhibition with feedback collated being taken into account before the implementation of plans commence.
