



PAMBULA TOWN CARAVAN PARK UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT

The NSW Crown Holiday Parks Trust (CHPT) will be looking at ways to modernise Pambula Town Caravan Park and increase visitor numbers after taking over management of the park this month.

NSW CHPT was formed to consolidate the operations of 26 coastal and nine inland holiday parks and reserves located on Crown Land throughout NSW in some of the State's most iconic locations. NSW CHPT incorporates North Coast Holiday Parks, South Coast Holiday Parks and Inland Waters Holiday Parks.

NSW CHPT CEO, Steve Edmonds said the Trust took over the management of Pambula Town Caravan Park from 1 August and was looking forward to making further improvements over the coming year.

"We are excited at the possibilities this park represents and we wish the outgoing managers John Price and Maria King all the very best for their future," Mr Edmonds said.

"John and Maria have dedicated many years to running this park and they are loved by many in the community.

"The Trust is initially looking at making some minor improvements to attract more tourists to the park which will in turn help to increase spending in the town of Pambula.

"We are also looking forward to working with key stakeholders such as park residents, Rotary, affiliated sports groups and the Bega Valley Shire Council to determine the best outcomes for the future of the park."
